2013 MILESTONES & ACCOMPLISHMENTS



Temporary Terminal



- Third full year of successful operation
- Key transportation link during the July & October BART strikes
- Welcomed inaugural run of AC Transit's new Transbay fleet



Temporary Terminal

- Additional benches installed to provide seating at every bus stop
- Additional security cameras installed at Clipper machines
- Staff trained in First Aid/ CPR and crisis management





2013 Milestones & Accomplishments Transit Center Design



- Redesigned exterior awning from glass to perforated aluminum incorporating the Penrose design, reducing Program costs by \$17M
- Redesigned glass reinforced concrete ceilings to metal, reducing Program costs by \$10M
- Completed the Phase 1 100% construction documents (CDs) for final peer review




- Completed the network Basis of Design for future Information Technology packages
- Completed negotiations with S.F. Public Utilities Commission for power to the Transit Center
- Design coordination with Transbay Transit
 Tower and 181 Fremont Street:
 - Executed foundation agreements with developers
 - Continued coordination between design teams for pedestrian bridges, gondola, and the Tim Hawkinson sculpture foundation design and construction




2013 Milestones & Accomplishments Bus Ramps

- Fact Sheets approved by Caltrans
- Completed foundation report
- Completed independent structural calculations
- Completed constructability reviews and bid packaging
- Pre-qualified seven bidders
- Issued for bid in November





2013 Milestones & Accomplishments Bus Storage



- Structural Type Selection approved by Caltrans
- Fact Sheets approved by Caltrans
- Project Study Report/Project
 Report submitted to Caltrans for final approval
- Completed structural mitigation analysis and submitted to Caltrans
- Issued 65% submittal to Caltrans and AC Transit for review and comment



2013 Milestones & Accomplishments

Downtown Rail Extension (DTX)

- The Metropolitan Transportation
 Commission adopted the final
 environmental evaluation for its
 Regional Transportation Plan –
 the RTP designates the DTX as a
 New Starts priority project
- The City continues to make progress towards formation of a Community Facilities District (Mello-Roos) for the Transit Center District to raise revenues for the Transbay Transit Center Program





2013 Milestones & Accomplishments Downtown Rail Extension

- California High-Speed Rail Authority (CHSRA), Caltrain, and Federal Railroad Administration signed off on track alignments
- CHSRA approved three design criteria variance requests
- Published a Notice of Preparation for the Supplemental EIS/EIR for Phase 2 DTX refinements



 Completed design concepts for the DTX to accommodate the City's proposals for reducing or eliminating the Railyard, developing the Railyard site, grounding portions of I-280, and undergrounding the rails at Mission Bay Drive and 16th Street



2013 Milestones & Accomplishments Archaeology

- Completed all archaeological field investigations and monitoring in the footprint of the Transit Center
- Completed archaeological plan for Bus Ramps construction
- Secured concurrence from the State Historic Preservation Officer on the archaeological plans for Blocks 6/7 and 11

- Split scope into three sections to attract more bidders

2013 Milestones & Accomplishments Construction

Buttress, Shoring, Excavation

- Completed buttress installation—182 shafts
- Bracing system 99% complete
- Excavation 96% complete
- Micropiles 70% complete

Below Grade Structure

- Grounding and geothermal are 65% complete
- Zones 1 and 2 mat slab waterproofing is complete
- Foundation mat slabs are 60% complete
- Walls in Zones 1 and 2 are in progress



- Installed Beale Street temporary bridge
- Completed the construction trestle across all zones

Structural Steel

- Mill order has been placed for 24,200 tons of steel
- 35 out of 304 cast nodes are complete




Utility Relocation

- Completed five utility relocation packages with 100% SBE participation
- Temporarily supported PG&E conduits under Beale Street for relocation of existing power lines in Block 5
- Increased the diameter of the auxiliary water supply system line along Mission street between First and Second streets
- Cleared Block 6 of utility encroachments



2013 Milestones & Accomplishments Construction



- Approximately 315,000 constructionrelated trade hours completed in 2013 with over 1,000,000 hours completed to date, including Temporary Terminal and Demolition
- No work stoppages or labor shortages



2013 Milestones & Accomplishments Outreach to Veterans




- Outreach to United Contractors helped create their "United for Veterans" construction hiring initiative
- Twenty companies have signed the initiative pledge, and two veteran apprentices have been hired
- Webcor/Obayashi has hired over a dozen veterans to staff positions
- Swords to Plowshares has formed a partnership with the City's Office of Economic and Workforce Development to conduct veterans outreach



Transbay Transit Tower

- Sale of the Tower parcel to Hines/Boston Properties
- Groundbreaking ceremony on the site to commemorate the transfer of the property on March 27
- Site permit issued by Department of Building Inspection in September
- Test pile installation began in December







Block 6/7

- Sale of Block 6 to developer Golub & Company to build market-rate residential housing
- Selection of Mercy Housing to develop Block 7 into affordable housing beginning in 2015

Block 9

- Selection of Avant Housing and Bridge Housing to develop market-rate residential units starting in 2014
- Purchase of the site by Avant-Essex

- Exploring alternate delivery methods (P3, DB) for Phase 2 DTX






FTA & FRA Oversight

- Integrated the Federal Transit
 Administration's (FTA) new Program
 Management Oversight Contractor
 into the Program
- Published the annual TIFIA report

- Updated Risk Assessment and Risk Register
- Developing list of secondary mitigation measures
- Held two quarterly meetings of the Risk Management Committee
- Issued Risk and Contingency
 Management Plan to the FTA and FRA

2013 Funding Accomplishments

Grant allocations approved:

AC Transit Capital Contribution \$2,148,388

One Bay Area Grant \$6,000,000

Proposition K Grant \$4,500,000

Regional Measure 1 Grant \$47,800,000

- Sale of State Parcel T for \$191.8 million for the development of the Transbay Transit Tower
- Sale of State Parcels P, P' and P" (Block 6/7) for \$30.6 million for redevelopment by the City's Office of Community Investment and Infrastructure
- Investment grade rating to pursue a TIFIA loan amendment for additional funding for use in Phase 1



Transbay Project Benefits – Seifel Study

- The Transbay Project will add over \$3.9 billion in value to existing and future real estate development on private properties within a ¾ mile radius of the Transit Center
- Seifel Study justifies taxes, fees, and assessments to property owners, developers, businesses, and residents in close proximity to the Transbay Project for construction, maintenance, and security for the Project
- Seifel Study justifies government grants and loans for the Project



Funding Activities Planned for 2014

- Continue to seek discretionary funding from US Department of Transportation and US Department of Homeland Security
- Seek TIFIA loan amendment to accelerate use of funds, increase debt capacity through subordinate debt, and refinance to increase loan amount
- Approval of a Mello-Roos Community Facilities District to levy a persquare-foot tax, calculated based on appropriate factors such as land use and development intensity
- Consider swap of Mello-Roos revenues with tax increment revenues to fund Phase 1 budget



Funding Activities Planned for 2014 (cont.)


- Approval of Community Business District to fund the maintenance and operations of the Rooftop Park
- Continue to seek full funding for Phase 2 DTX
 - Work with local funding partners to obtain local funding commitment as part of the New Starts Funding Plan
 - Consider alternative delivery and funding plans for Phase 2 such as Design-Build and Design-Build-Finance-Maintain



- Staffed 24-hour construction hotline
- Continued quarterly newsletters highlighting project components and milestones
- Reduction of complaints year over year:
 - 2011 (6 months): 104 complaints
 - > 2012 (12 months): 78 complaints
 - 2013 (12 months): 56 complaints

 - Updated software across whole website






Interviews and videos showcase those who are involved in the project on a day-to-day basis and are directly responsible for its continuing progress:
