<u>Agenda Item 5 – Expenditures and Commitments of Proceeds of the City Financing that Require</u> <u>CRC Approval</u>

Commitments

At the February 17, 2017 Cost Review Committee (CRC) meeting, the committee gave authorization for TJPA to issue commitments (budget appropriations) for various construction, construction administration, and legal costs of up to \$150 million in City Financing proceeds. Here are the commitments to-date:

The City also had costs of issuance, and the first draw was for the minimum \$5 million borrowing amount from Wells Fargo. It is anticipated that Disbursement Request No. 2 will be submitted in March for approximately \$9.54 million.

Upcoming Commitments

As shown in the attached commitment and cash flow schedule, total commitments of the City Financing would reach an estimated \$168.8 million in June of 2017, with issuance of the following NTPs, CCOs or RFS:

Based on the estimated cash flow at this time, it is anticipated that \$65.4 million in actual draws would be requested through June.

In July 2017, the City will issue the first tranche of Mello-Roos Community Facilities District bonds for the Transbay projects. Net bond proceeds are projected to be between 110 - 133 million, depending upon the bond rating. Upon availability of proceeds, TJPA plans to reverse some of the appropriations above, for a net decrease in commitments of 35.5 million. This would bring commitments down to 133.4 million, under the planned 150 million use of City Financing proceeds, and commitments would not be expected to increase materially after that.

TJPA and SFPW staff request authorization to make the above listed commitments, and request that future draws based upon those commitments be approved, assuming TJPA's proper submission of appropriate documentation.

The Transit Center Project Team anticipates executing or recommending the following professional services contract awards/amendments requiring CRC action between March - May 2017.

Bus Storage Construction

The Bus Storage facility will be used primarily by AC Transit for weekday layovers between peak hour commutes. Bounded by Second, Third, Perry, and Stillman streets below the Interstate 80 west approach

to the Bay Bridge, the facility will include 49 bus stalls, AC Transit offices, storage, and restrooms. A visual and sound barrier wall will screen portions of the facility from adjacent residential properties. The project is subject to oversight by the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) because of its location on state right-of-way, under the freeway. The project was advertised in January 2017 with bids opened on March 1, 2017. The low bid was \$21,608,720 from Ghilotti Construction. The budget was \$20,020,000, so the TJPA Board will be asked for approval to utilize Program Reserve in the amount of \$1,588,720. This was an "A+B" bid and Ghilotti Construction's bid on the time portion was 281 days. Therefore, the construction is expected to complete in summer 2018. As noted above, this work would be funded with City Financing proceeds.

Construction Change Orders above the \$250,000 threshold

There are no new change orders to be presented since the February 17 CRC meeting. One change order previously presented has a slight increase between the amount previously presented to the CRC (\$425,000) and the final negotiated amount (\$425,742). This CCO (No. 1043) is for costs related to the seismic upgrades to the access trestle needed to erect the structural steel. The access trestle bracing modifications were necessary to meet the 475-year seismic event design criteria. The access trestle provided to the TG07.1 structural steel subcontractor met the requirements for the 475-year seismic event design criteria, but when a portion of the trestle was removed by the subcontractor in order to erect steel, the access trestle became unstable and as a result new seismic bracing was required. On July 13, 2016, the Dispute Resolution Advisor recommended that the TG07.1 subcontractor be compensated for the seismic upgrades to the access trestle. Subsequent to the February CRC meeting, additional merited work was identified which should be included in the final price. This merited work amount increased the requested CCO amount to \$425,742. Therefore, this CCO is being brought back to the CRC for its concurrence as its agreed-upon amount exceeds the previously presented not-to-exceed amount. The funding source for this CCO is TIFIA Loan proceeds.

The attached change order log provides further detail on all CCOs presented to the CRC to-date.
