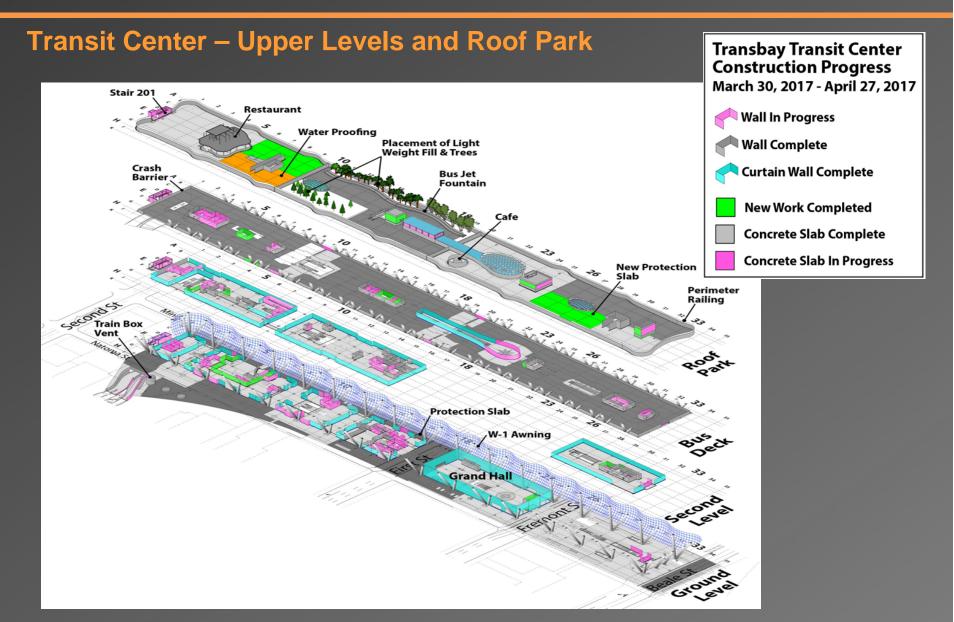

Western Zone (GL 1-10)

- Rooftop waterproofing and protection is underway.
- W1 Exterior Awning nearing completion.
- Bus Deck ceiling framing well underway.
- Main Distribution Frame (MDF) Room and Intermediate Distribution Frame (IDF) Rooms are underway. Electric switchgear and transformer rooms near completion.
- Equipment rooms buildout in progress.
 (Fire water tanks, Pumps, HVAC Units)
- Metal stud framing of walls, gypsum board, and curtain wall systems install underway.



Central Zone (GL 10-20)

- Rooftop landscaping and fountain is underway in the north and south.
- All rooftop glass (W10 skylight, W8 glass canopy wall) is installed with trim and leak testing underway.
- Rooftop and Bus Deck seismic joint assembly/ install is in progress.
- Glass Curtain Wall systems install at the Bus Deck level and Ground level are nearing completion.
- Wall framing, gyp board, and metal wall panel enclosures in progress.
- Mechanical/Electrical/Plumbing/Fire Sprinkler (MEPF) install continues.
- Buildout of the Main Electrical, Switchgear and Main Transformer rooms continues.









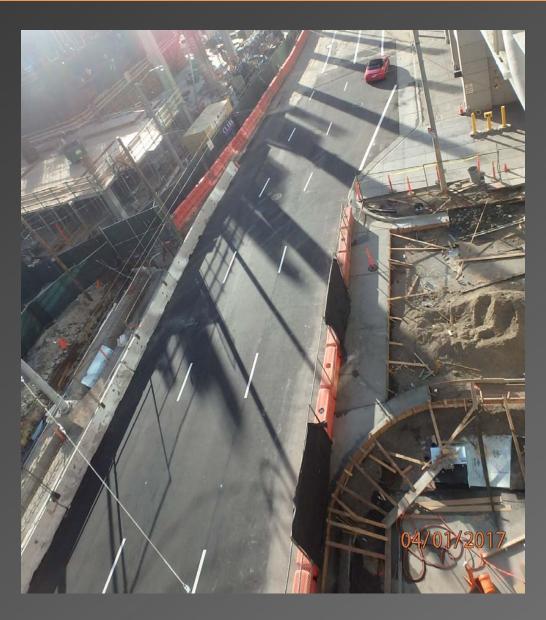


Eastern Zone (GL 20-35)

- Rooftop Café walls complete.
- Rooftop Light Column "Oculus"
 Skylight W4 Glass Curtain wall is installed with trim underway.
- Rooftop waterproofing and slab protection continues.
- W1 Exterior Awning installation now in progress.
- Bus Deck concrete drive aisle and pedestrian island nearing completion awaiting scaffold removal and bollards around Light Column.
- All levels now have metal stud framing of walls, gypsum board, curtain wall systems installation underway.
- MEPF systems installation and testing continues at all levels.



Beale Street Bridge Removal March 2017

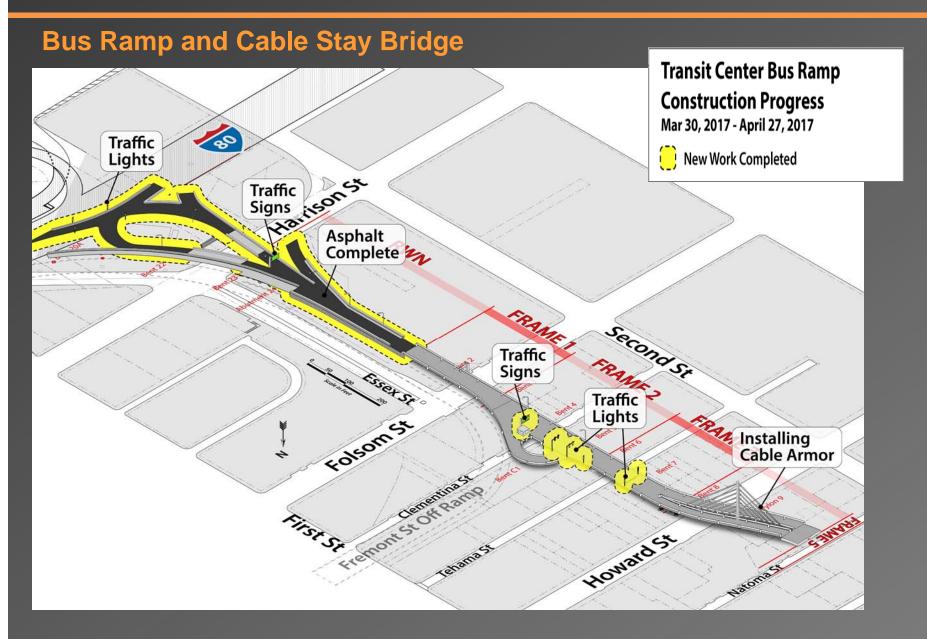


SEQUENCE

- 5. Transbay permanent OCS Poles and switches, OCS overhead wires
- 6. Bus testing completed Friday night March 31, 2017.
- 7. Beale Street open Saturday April 1, 2017



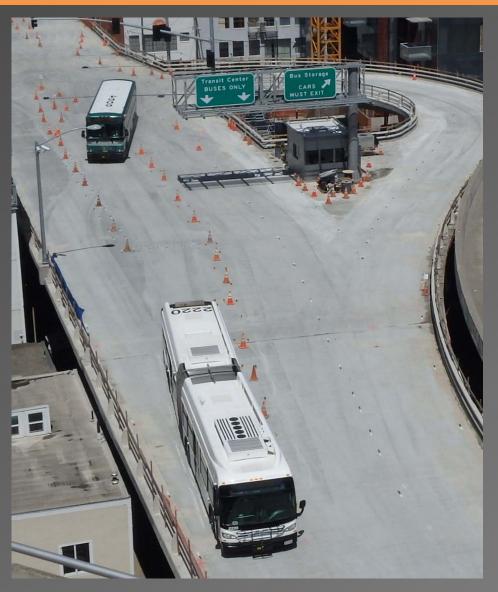

Bus Ramp/Bridge

- All approach slabs and final asphalt paving is complete at all areas of the Bus Ramp.
- Concrete barriers and ST-10 steel railings near complete all areas.
- Security Guard Booth and security cameras are in testing.
- Overhead message signs, Ramp street lights and ramp crash cushions are now installed.
- On Ramp Bus Test with both AC Transit and SFMTA for final striping was satisfactorily completed on April 19-20.
- Cable Stay Bridge contractor (VSL) is near completion.

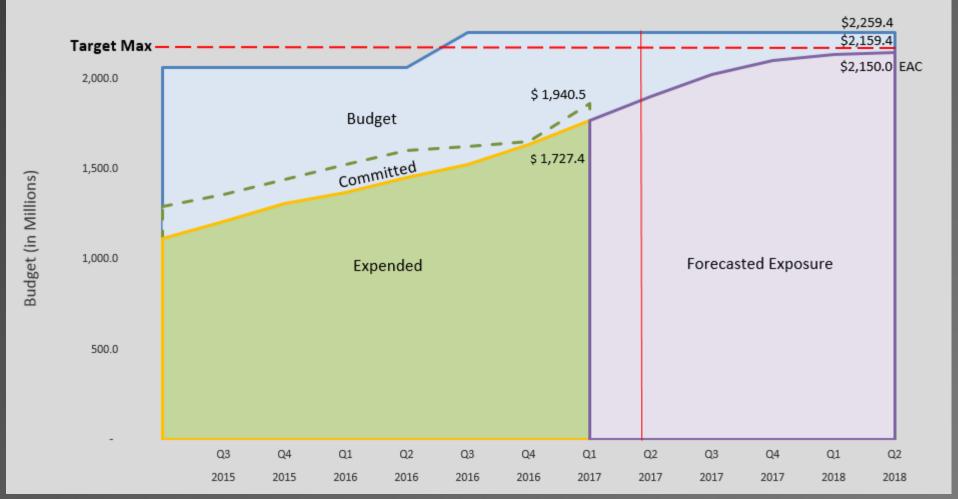

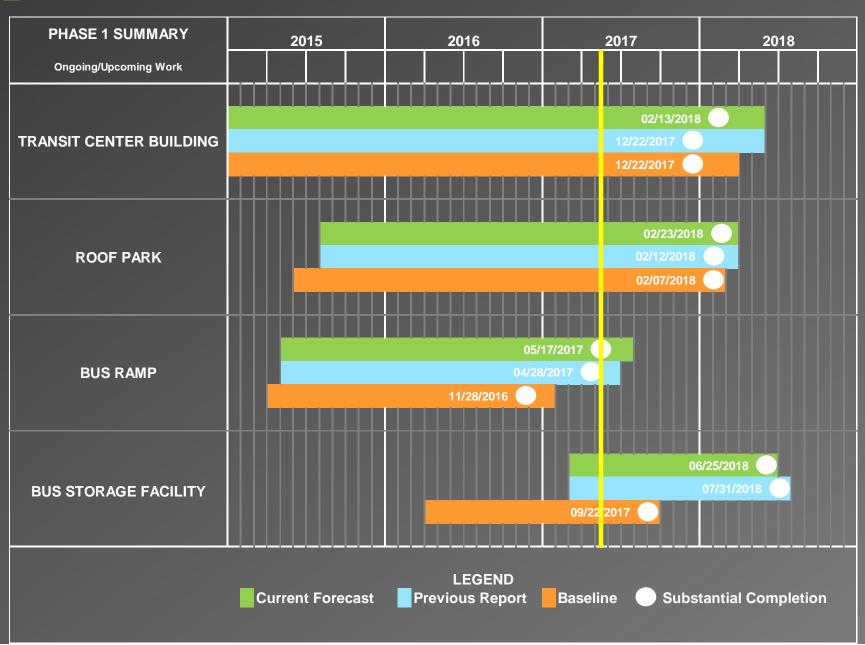

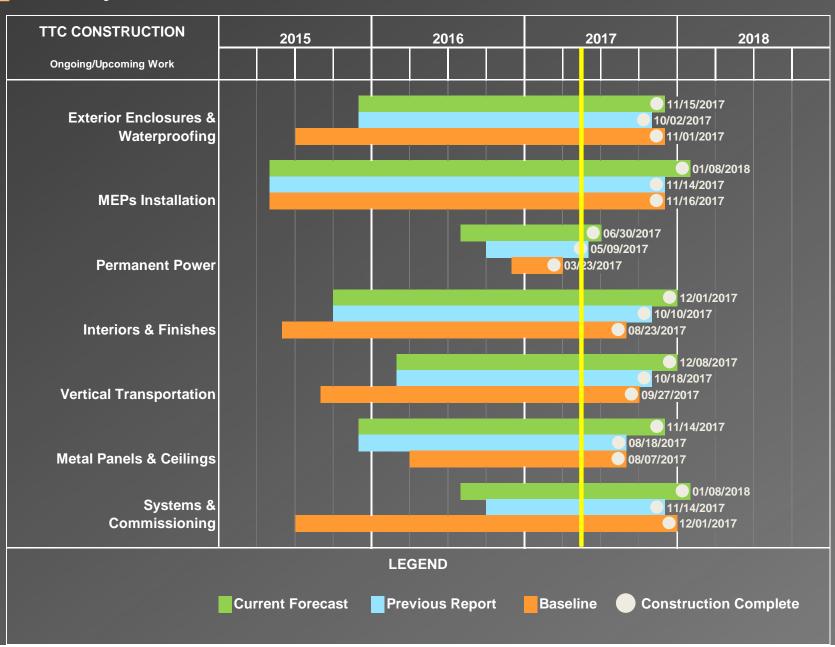

Schedule currently indicating a 7 week slippage on Substantial Completion.

Challenged Activities include:

- 1. Electrical Subcontract both Normal Voltage and Low Voltage Distribution.
- 2. Main & Intermediate Distribution Frame Rooms. (MDF & IDF Rooms)
- 3. Concern on Roof Park soil installation.

Mitigation Measures

- 1. Enlisted additional 2nd Tier Electrical Subcontractors for selective work.
- 2. Implementation of strategic premium time work hours on weekends.
- 3. WOJV elevated focus on Commissioning with new personnel.
- 4. Project Leadership issue resolution forum continues to avoid delays.

Systems Installation & Commissioning

Building Management, Fire / Life Safety and Security Systems installation and commissioning activities will drive the schedule as we approach Substantial Completion.

Pre-Mitigation Strategy

- 1. Focus of Bimonthly Temporary Certificate of Occupancy (TCO) Meetings.
 - Activity Concentration on Priority Electrical and Data Rooms.
 - Permanent Power to Power to Building.
- 2. SFFD Fire Alarm Review and Approvals followed on Risk List closely.
- 3. Specific Items to monitor:
 - Roof Park Pylons relationship to Fire Alarm System as well as Emergency Communication System / Mass Notification.
 - Door Hardware interface & coordination with Building Management Systems & Security Systems.

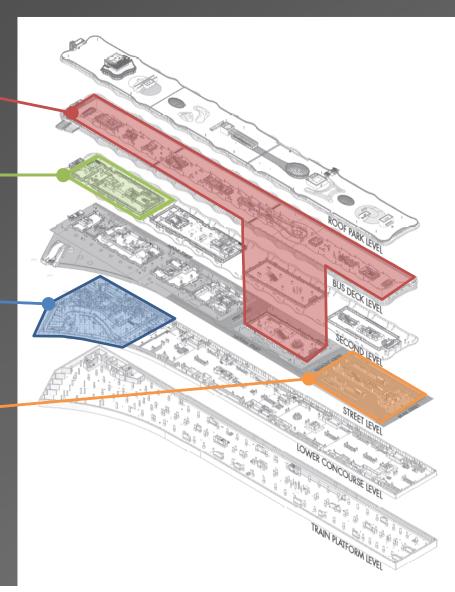

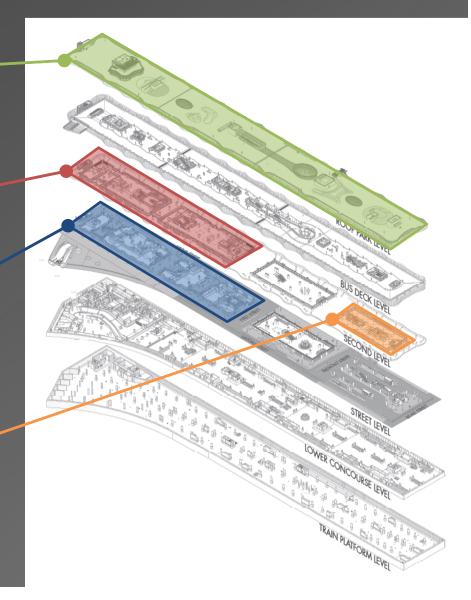

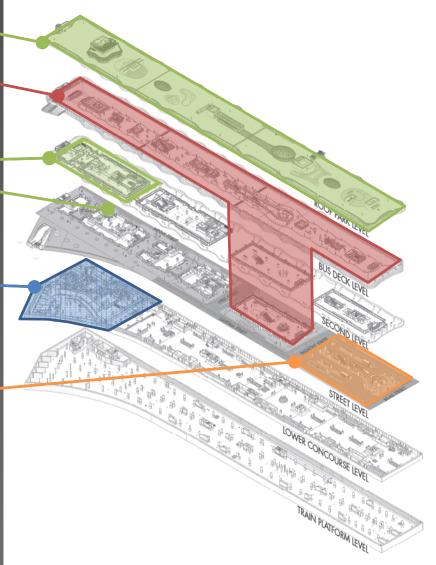

- Convened Communications Staff from Partner Agencies to Discuss Initial Ideas and Form Working Group:
 - San Francisco Public Works
 - AC Transit
 - San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency
 - Additional Partner Agencies, Including Funding Partners, will be incorporated as Planning Process Proceeds (Caltrain, CalTrans, SFCTA, MTC)
- Proposed Event Details
 - Program in Grand Hall (Eliminates Weather Uncertainty)
 - "Open House" Following Program to Allow Public to Explore TTC and Rooftop Park
 - Planned for Week of President's Day in 2018
 - Falls Immediately After Park Completion and Just Before Beginning of AC Transit Operations
 - Coincides with Congressional Recess
- Media Tours Scheduled for Week Preceding Opening Event
