3. Communications

Secretary Bonner provided instructions on the Public Call-in/Comment process.

• Chair's Report

Chair Bouchard presented the Chair's report.

Chair Bouchard concluded her report by noting a recent event hosted by the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency and attended by San Francisco Mayor London Breed, U.S. House of Representatives Speaker Nancy Pelosi, and U.S. Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg. She noted that she was encouraged to hear they included the DTX project as a priority.

Public Comment:

Roland Lebrun read an excerpt from a San Francisco Examiner article about the Gateway Program, a project on the East Coast, and he suggested that closed captioning be provided at the ESC meetings.

4. Action Item:

Approval of Special Meeting Minutes: August 19, 2022

There was no member of the public wishing to comment.

A motion to approve the minutes was made by Vice Chair Chang and seconded by Member Sweet. A unanimous voice vote approved the motion.

5. Action Item:

Motion to Approve the Continued Use of Teleconferencing Technologies for Meetings of the ESC pursuant to Assembly Bill 361

There was no member of the public wishing to comment.

A motion was made by Vice Chair Chang and seconded by Member Whitehorn. A unanimous voice vote approved the motion.

6. Informational Item:

Downtown Rail Extension Project Delivery Strategy: Implementation Plan

DTX Project Director Alfonso Rodriguez and San Francisco County Transportation Authority (SFCTA) Rail Program Manager Jesse Koehler presented the item.

Chair Bouchard commented that she appreciated the addition of the testing and commissioning phase for the DTX in the implementation plan, given that the DTX will patch into Caltrain's existing system. Member Klein stated that securing the funding is an important issue and noted that she did not see the funding milestones represented on the graphic in the presentation. Vice Chair Chang stated that the implementation plan is a good basis for discussions on governance and funding, and also stated that the next tranche of local SFCTA funds as well as financing through the City's funding sources are coming up. She suggested that the implementation graphic could also be used as part of the project management plan submittal to the Federal Transit Administration in February.

Public Comment:

Roland Lebrun expressed concern about the budget and the role of consultants.

Jim Patrick stated the Project Labor Agreement (PLA) is an input to project cost. He noted the PLA calls for paying the highest cost for labor possible and that it should call for the lowest cost possible. He asked the ESC to consider this idea.

7. Public Comment

Members of the public may provide comment on matters within the ESC's purview that are not on the agenda.

Roland Lebrun said the ESC will need to transition from a policy-making body to a body that engages in strict project monitoring protocols.
