I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

JOB No. 30100 SAN FRANCISCO CALIFORNIA

The Transbay Joint Powers Authority's new Transbay Transit Center (TTC) is under construction on the site of the former Transbay Terminal in downtown San Francisco and will serve eleven transportation systems: AC Transit, BART, Caltrain, Golden Gate Transit, Greyhound, Muni, SamTrans, WestCAT Lynx, Amtrak, Paratransit and future California High Speed Rail. As a new one million square foot regional transportation facility serving San Francisco the TTC is comprised of the following levels:

- Train Station Passenger Platform Level
- Train Concourse Level
- Ground Level
- Second Level
- Elevated Bus Level
- 5.4 acre Park Level Roof

The project has three components:

Transbay Transit Center: Bounded to the East by Main Street, to the West by Second Street, to the North by Minna Street and the South by Natoma Street. The TTC will be approximately 1600 feet long, 180 feet wide, 60 feet below grade and 60 feet above grade.

Utility Relocation: Scope is for purposes of adjusting utilities in vicinity of the TTC. The work encompasses the area between Second Street and Main Street and between Market Street and Howard Street. It involves relocation of water lines, sewer lines, sludge lines, demolition of existing utilities and coordination with PG&E and all telecom agencies.

Bus Ramp: Scope includes elevated roadways connecting the Elevated Bus Level with the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge and with bus storage under the Bay Bridge's West Approach structure. These ramps will approach the TTC from the south and connect to the TTC at the southwest corner.

II. SCOPE OF CONSTRUCTION SERVICES TG10.3 Heating, Ventilating, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) JOB No. 30100 SAN FRANCISCO CALIFORNIA

The scope of work for the Heating, Ventilating, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) (Trade Package) includes all construction services for all necessary labor, material, equipment, supplies, and supervision required to complete the work in accordance with the bid documents and as noted below:

TG10.3 Heating, Ventilating, and Air Conditioning (HVAC)

The major items of the work for this package or any part thereof are anticipated to consist of the following elements:

Cooling towers, hydronic cooling & heating, fluid coolers, indoor air handling units, evaporative aircooling equipment, heat exchangers, custom breechings, chimneys and stacks, performance based specifications, commissioning, and BIM (3D, 4D & 5D) on complex projects. Also included are engineering, coordination, procurement and complete installation of the respective systems.

This is a LEEDTM project and all aspects of design, construction, documentation and maintenance are balanced with first cost, sustainability and energy efficiency. The project has set a goal of achieving a minimum LEEDTM certification of Silver and certification level of Gold is being explored. Trade Subcontractors will be an integral part of the team that ensures that the project meets the established LEEDTM requirements.

Payment and performance bonds may be required for this Trade Subcontractor.

Insurance: In addition to general liability insurance, Trade Subcontractor shall carry pollution liability insurance in place for this project. The additional insured will be identified in the bid documents.

IV. QUALIFYING, BIDDING, AND CONTRACTING TG10.3 Heating, Ventilating, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) JOB No. 30100 SAN FRANCISCO CALIFORNIA

The purpose of this RFQ is to identify Trade Subcontractors qualified to perform the Heating, Ventilating, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) scope of work for the project. The contract for the Heating, Ventilating, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) work will ultimately be awarded by Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture to the qualified and responsible bidder submitting the lowest responsive bid, subject to the approval of the TJPA.

The Bidder shall submit a Request for Qualification (RFQ) package no later than <u>2:00 p.m.</u> Pacific time on <u>November 15, 2013</u>.

Notification of the qualification will be provided to the Bidder by <u>December 10, 2013</u>. Bids submitted by non-qualified Bidders will not be accepted or opened. Non-qualified Bidders assume all risk and costs associated with submitting a bid if they are deemed not qualified.

Trade Subcontractors will be required to comply with the Federal procurement rules and guidelines set forth in Federal Transit Administration Circular 4220.1.F, the Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State and local Governments, in the FTA Best Practices Procurement Manual, and at 49 CFR Part 18 and Part 26. Trade Subcontractors will also be required to comply with all provisions of section 1770 *et seq.* of the California Labor Code. Procurement will be without regard to race, gender, religion, affiliation, or sexual orientation.

V. QUALIFICATION AND BIDDING PROCESS TG10.3 Heating, Ventilating, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) JOB No. 30100 SAN FRANCISCO CALIFORNIA

QUALIFICATION:

Qualification Requirement: All Trade Subcontractors who wish to submit a bid for the Heating, Ventilating, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) scope of work shall be qualified. It is mandatory that the respective Trade Subcontractor fully complete the qualification questionnaire and provide all materials requested herein. No bid will be accepted from a Trade Subcontractor who has failed to comply with these requirements.

<u>Package Issuance Timeline</u>: Starting <u>October 17, 2013</u>, RFQ packages will be available. Interested Trade Subcontractors should download the RFQ directly from the TJPA website.

Questions: Questions or clarifications regarding the qualification forms <u>must be</u> submitted in writing no later than **2:00 p.m. on** <u>October 31, 2013</u>, by e-mail to Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture at TransbayBidding_TG10.3@webcor-obayashi.com, or by fax to (510) 748-7805. No questions will be accepted after 2:00 p.m. on <u>October 31, 2013</u>. The answers to RFQ questions will be posted on the TJPA's website.

<u>Application Submittal and Due Date</u>: Each questionnaire must be signed under penalty of perjury in the manner designated at the end of the form, by an individual who has the legal authority to bind the Trade Subcontractor on whose behalf that person is signing. If any information provided by a Trade Subcontractor becomes inaccurate, the Trade Subcontractor must immediately notify Tim Maxwell at Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture and provide updated accurate information in writing, under penalty of perjury.

Each Trade Subcontractor shall submit one original and four copies of its response to this RFQ in writing to Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture, 175 Beale Street, San Francisco, CA, 94105. Qualification documents <u>must be</u> submitted no later than **2:00p.m. on November 15, 2013**. Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture reserves the right to extend the date for qualification packages and/or request, receive, and evaluate supplemental information after the above time and date at its sole determination. Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture reserves the right to waive minor irregularities and omissions in the information contained in the qualification application submitted, and to make all final determinations.

Incomplete or Late Submittals: Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture may refuse to grant qualification where the requested information and materials are not provided, or not provided by the last date to submit the questionnaire noted above. There is no appeal from a refusal for an incomplete or late application. The closing time to accept RFQs will not be changed in order to accommodate supplementation of incomplete submissions, or late submissions.

Interviews: Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture at its own discretion may conduct interviews with any or all of the Trade Subcontractors responding to the RFQ to better determine their qualifications to perform work required under the project. Interviews will be for clarification of Trade Subcontractor's

responses in the Qualification Application, for discussion of additional information, and to supplement Trade Subcontractor's responses in the Qualification Application.

Determination of Qualification: Trade Subcontractor's Qualification Statement must be completed and submitted along with supplemental information required. Failure to do so will render the application incomplete. Trade Subcontractor may be deemed not qualified for falsification of information.

The review, evaluation, and score for each Trade Subcontractor's application will be performed by a panel consisting of representatives of TJPA, the Program Management/Program Controls Consultant, the Construction Management Oversight Consultant, and Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture. The scoring will be based on the following objective evaluation criteria:

Section I: Essential Requirements for Qualification:

To qualify, a Trade Subcontractor **will be required** to have a passing grade within this area. A Trade Subcontractor is subject to **disqualification** if the answer to any of questions in Part "A" are "no" or if the answer to any questions in Part "B" are "yes".

Section II: Scoring Section:

Included in this section are questions which will be scored. There is a maximum of 300 points possible. Trade Subcontractor who receives **250** or more points will pass this section. In addition to the questionnaire, Trade Subcontractor must provide the requested information for the project experience category. Trade Subcontractor must submit 5 relevant projects, 3 of its largest projects and **all** of its projects performed for the City and County of San Francisco in the last five years. Failure to provide the requested information shall render the submittal incomplete.

Trade Subcontractor must qualify under both Section I and receive the minimum points under Section II to pass the Qualification requirement.

Trade Subcontractor will be notified in writing about its qualification status. Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture reserves the right to adjust, increase, limit, suspend or rescind the qualification rating based on subsequently learned information. Trade Subcontractor whose rating changes sufficient to disqualify it will be notified, and given an opportunity for an appeal consistent with the appeal procedures described below for appealing a qualification rating.

While it is the intent of the qualification questionnaire and required documents to assist Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture in determining a Trade Subcontractor's qualification prior to bid and to aid in the selection of the lowest responsible bidder, neither the fact of qualification, nor any qualification rating, will preclude Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture, in its discretion, from a post-bid consideration and determination of whether a Trade Subcontractor has the quality, fitness, capacity and experience to satisfactorily perform the proposed work, and has demonstrated the requisite trustworthiness.

Appeals Process: Where a timely and completed application results in a rating below that necessary to qualify, an appeal can be made. Trade Subcontractor may file an appeal by delivering a completed Request for Appeal (Attachment 6) to Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture, no later than five days after the

notification date as to its qualification. Without a timely appeal, Trade Subcontractor waives any and all rights to challenge the decision of Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture, whether by administrative process, judicial process or any other legal process or proceeding.

If Trade Subcontractor files a complete and timely Request for Appeal, a review of the appeal shall be conducted so that it is concluded soon after receipt of the Request for Appeal. The review shall be an informal process conducted by Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture, PMPC, and the TJPA and will be based upon the information submitted by Trade Subcontractor in its Request for Appeal. Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture will notify Trade Subcontractor in writing of the decision at the conclusion of the review. The decision is final and is not subject to appeal or challenge whether by administrative process, judicial process or any other legal process or proceeding.

Financial Responsibility: Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture accepts no financial responsibility for any costs incurred by a firm in responding to this RFQ. Submissions to Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture under this RFQ will become the property of the TJPA and may be used by the TJPA in any way deemed appropriate.

No Waiver: No waiver by Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture of any provision of this RFQ shall be implied from any failure by Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture to recognize or take action on account of any failure by a Trade Subcontractor to observe any provision of this RFQ.

No Representations or Warranties: The information presented in this RFQ and in any report or other information provided by Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture to a Trade Subcontractor is provided solely for its convenience. It is the sole responsibility of a Trade Subcontractor to assure for itself that the information contained in this RFQ or other documents are accurate and complete. No representations, assurances or warranties pertaining to the accuracy of such information are or will be provided by the TJPA or its advisors.

No Conflict of Interest: Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture and the TJPA shall disqualify any Trade Subcontractor that has a conflict of interest under Section C8.105 of the San Francisco Charter, Government Code Section 1090 *et. seq.*, the Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 87100 *et. seq.*), or any other applicable conflict of interest laws. Any false, incomplete, or otherwise unresponsive statements made in connection with a proposal may be cause for its disqualification at Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture and the TJPA's sole discretion.

Anticipated Bidding Process:

Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture anticipates the bidding process will proceed as follows:

- 1. Bids will be accepted only from Trade Subcontractors who are pre-qualified, or who are able to be qualified at time of bid. Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture will inform Trade Subcontractors where to buy plans. Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture will distribute Bidding Documents to Plan Rooms in the Bay Area to encourage second tier and SBE subcontractors to bid their work to the qualified Trade Subcontractors.
- 2. A pre-bid meeting will be held after the documents are distributed.

- 3. Trade Subcontractors will submit their bids. Bids will be opened publicly. Only bids submitted by qualified Trade Subcontractors will be opened. All bids received from non-qualified Trade Subcontractors will be returned to the respective Trade Subcontractors unopened.
- 4. The Trade Subcontract, if awarded, will be awarded to the qualified and responsible Trade Subcontractor submitting the lowest responsive bid, as determined by Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture and the TJPA. Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture reserves the right to reject any bid for TG10.3 Heating, Ventilating, and Air Conditioning (HVAC). The award of any Trade Subcontract is subject to the approval of the TJPA.
- 5. A Trade Subcontractor wishing to be qualified should be aware that if it is a successful bidder, it must comply with all bid conditions including, but not limited to:
 - a. Supply any additional company information for bonding purposes within 10 days of notification of qualification.
 - b. Furnishing required insurance certificates within 10 days of notice of intent to award and maintaining required insurance;
 - c. Complying with the TJPA's Small Business Enterprise (SBE) program, or as stipulated by Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture;
 - d. Possession of a Business Tax Registration Certificate. Before any contract can be certified as to the availability of funds and before a Notice to Proceed can be issued, Trade Subcontractor must provide Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture with a copy of a current Business Tax Registration Certificate pursuant to San Francisco Ordinance 345-88. Trade Subcontractors can register for a current certificate with the Business Tax Division of the Tax Collector of the City of San Francisco;
 - e. Confirming the personnel who will be assigned to the project. Trade Subcontractors should anticipate potential penalties if the personnel designated to be assigned to the project are changed without the prior approval of Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture;
 - f. Providing an audited financial statement verifying the ratios provided in the qualification form and confirming their financial worthiness to perform the work;
 - g. Certifying compliance with all applicable federal regulations, including Buy America; and
 - h. Signing a letter of assent to the TJPA Project Labor Agreement.

VI. OTHER REQUIREMENTS JOB No. 30100 SAN FRANCISCO CALIFORNIA

A. Complete Response: All responses shall be complete, including all required information and attachments in order to be responsive and eligible for qualification.

B. Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Program:

- 1. The TJPA Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Program will apply to all Trade Subcontractors. SBE Program is available on the Transbay Transit Center website: http://www.transbaycenter.org/tjpa/doing-business-with-the-tjpa.
- 2. There will be SBE subcontracting requirements for each trade package. This Trade Package has an SBE utilization goal of 20%. Trade Subcontractors shall provide the anticipated percent of the amount of the Trade Subcontract that will be contracted to SBE firms and the plan they propose to implement to achieve this goal, along with a list of projects that they have participated in and met the SBE requirement.

C. Trade Subcontractors currently engaged on the project may submit qualifications, but personnel submitted in the Qualification package for TG10.3 Heating, Ventilating, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) must be completely separate and distinct personnel from Trade Subcontractors' personnel otherwise engaged on this project.

D. Trade Subcontractors are solely responsible for ensuring receipt of any and all addenda.

VII. WEBCOR/OBAYASHI JOINT VENTURE'S RIGHTS AND OPTIONS JOB No. 30100 SAN FRANCISCO CALIFORNIA

Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture reserves the right to postpone selection for its own convenience, to withdraw this RFQ at any time, and to reject any and all submittals without indicating any reason for such rejection. As a function of the RFQ process, Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture reserves the right to remedy technical errors in response to the RFQ and to modify the published scope of services. Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture reserves the right to request that specific personnel with specific expertise be added to the Trade Subcontractor's team, if Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture determines that specific expertise is lacking in the project team.

Statements and other materials submitted will not be returned.

Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture reserves the right to abandon this RFQ process and/or change its procurement process for this Trade Package at any time if it is determined that abandonment and/or change would be in Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture's best interest. In the event of an abandonment or change, Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture will not be liable to any Trade Subcontractor for any costs or damages arising out of or relating to its response to the RFQ.

The issuance of this RFQ does not constitute an agreement by Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture that any Trade Subcontract will actually be entered into. Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture expressly reserves the right at any time to:

- waive or correct any defect or informality in any response, proposal, or proposal procedure, as determined by Webcor/Obayashi Joint Venture in its sole discretion;
- reissue an RFQ;
- prior to the submission deadline for proposals, modify all or any portion of the selection procedures, including deadlines for accepting responses, the specifications or requirements for any materials, equipment or services to be provided under this RFQ, or the requirements for contents or format of the proposals;
- request that one or more Trade Subcontractors clarify, supplement, or modify the information submitted;
- extend deadlines for accepting responses; request amendments to responses after the expiration of deadlines; request clarifications, revised proposals or best and final offers; or negotiate or approve final agreements; and
- consider any information about any Trade Subcontractor that is not expressly contained in Trade Subcontractor's response.

Any interpretation of, or change in, this RFQ will be made by addendum, and shall become part of the RFQ.
