TRANSBAY JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

On February 15, 2007, the TJPA Board of Directors approved the appointment of the fifteen inaugural members to the TJPA Citizens Advisory Committee (TJPA CAC). In accordance with Article 2, Section 3, of the TJPA CAC bylaws, the newly appointed CAC members drew lots at the first meeting of the TJPA CAC on April 10, 2007, to determine which would serve initial one year terms and which would serve full two year terms. Eight members drew initial two year terms which are expiring this year. One other member of the CAC has resigned so that nine seats on the committee must be filled.

The TJPA CAC bylaws specify that members be selected to represent the following categories:

- 1. Daily Caltrain Rider into San Francisco
- 2. Daily AC Transit Transbay Rider into San Francisco
- 3. Daily MUNI Rider on a line that terminates or passes through the Transbay Terminal
- 4. Local Resident from District 6 (zip code 94105 or 94107)
- 5. Local Business from District 6 (zip code 94105 or 94107)
- 6. Environmentalist
- 7. Member of a planning or good-government non-profit organization
- 8. Representative from labor
- 9. Bicycle advocate
- 10. Disabled advocate
- 11. San Francisco based public transit advocate
- 12. Regional transit advocate
- 13. Regional transit advocate
- 14. Member of the citywide (San Francisco) business community
- 15. Member with expertise in real estate development or real estate finance

The criteria for membership were established to ensure a qualified committee of regional stakeholders with a diverse array of knowledge and interest/advocacy aligned with the principal components that define the Program. Membership requires affiliation with at least one category, and the bylaws further specify that this mix of representation be preserved when replacement members are appointed to the CAC. The members who have resigned or whose terms are expiring represented the following categories:

- 1. Bicycle Advocate
- 2. Daily AC Transit Transbay Rider into San Francisco
- 3. Daily Caltrain Rider into San Francisco
- 4. Daily MUNI Rider
- 5. Disabled Advocate
- 6. Labor Representative
- 7. Local Resident of District 6

- 8. Member of San Francisco Citywide business community
- 9. Regional transit advocate

The TJPA solicited applications for new and returning members between December 2008 and February 2009 with applications for membership accepted through February 13, 2009. The TJPA received twelve applications including three current members who reapplied.

After reviewing the applications, Staff recommends that the Board of Directors reappoint three members to the CAC and appoint three new members to fill three of the vacant seats:

Staff recommends additional outreach and solicitation prior to filling the three remaining vacant seats. Making the recommended appointments will allow the CAC to continue to meet while additional candidates are being sought.

APPLICATION SOLICITATION OUTREACH

Prior to forming the CAC, TJPA staff developed, and the TJPA Board of Directors approved, an application for membership that asks for qualifications for membership, a statement of the applicant's objectives and goals, and affiliation(s) and references. This same application was used in soliciting new members.

The call for applications was posted on the TJPA website at <u>www.transbaycenter.org/cac</u>, distributed via e-newsletter to the more than 500 people on the TJPA outreach list, and circulated through SFMTA and AC Transit. Additionally, the announcement and application were distributed to individuals who applied for membership in 2007 and 2008, but were not selected. Finally, applications were available at the TJPA Office. The TJPA received applications at the office in person and via US Postal Service, facsimile, and e-mail.

APPLICATIONS RECEIVED

The TJPA received thirteen applications from eleven men and two women. Eight applicants are San Francisco residents, four are from the East Bay, and one is from the Marin County.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE TJPA CAC

The Staff recommends approval of one candidate for each of the six categories being vacated, pursuant to Article 2, Section 4 of the Bylaws of the Transbay Joint Powers Authority Citizens Advisory Committee. The recommended members include four men and two women.

NEXT STEPS

The attached resolution appoints the six recommended applicants for membership on the TJPA CAC. Appointed members will be contacted and invited to the next meeting of the TJPA CAC, which will be held in April 2009 at the TJPA offices at 201 Mission Street, Suite 2100.
