

Parcel F Site Inspection

Welcome to the Transbay Transit Center!

We look forward to seeing you at the Parcel F Site Inspection and to tour the construction progress of the (TTC) Transbay Transit Center Project. Your Safety is very important to us and you must understand that construction sites can be dangerous. In fact, we require that visitor's wear appropriate protection when entering our construction site, such as hard hats, safety vests and safety glasses.

The event will occur at an active construction site, so the information is essential to your safety!

Overview:

We will be providing an overview of the Transbay Transit Center Project. Afterward, we will provide a guided tour of the construction site. We will provide a safety briefing discussing some of the construction activities in progress and the safety issues that visitors may be exposed to at the TTC Construction site; it is required that visitor's wear appropriate protection when entering our construction site.

Location: The briefing will take place at 201 Mission Street Suite 2100. You will be escorted onto the construction site by a construction tour guide.

Transportation: Our office is located on the corner of Mission and Beale Street. We encourage guests to walk, bike, take a taxi or take Muni to the event. The Muni bus routes stop nearby or the Temporary Transit Center on Howard Street or the 14 Mission Bus line. The site is also a half-mile walk from the Embarcadero or Montgomery Street Muni/BART Station.

Parking: Event parking will **not** be available. Metered street parking is limited in neighboring blocks, and some parking lots and garages are within walking distance.

Attire: For safety reasons, full-length pants are required on site. Guests wearing shorts, capris, skirts or dresses will not be allowed onto the construction site.

Shoes: If you are participating in the tour, you must wear the appropriate shoes. Shoes shall be close toed, should be leather with a defined heel such as walking shoes, hiking boots or work boots. For safety reasons, you may not participate in the tour if you are wearing open toed shoes, high heeled shoes or boots, sneakers, sandals, pumps, fashion boots, loafers or any other shoes that are not considered safe for walking on a construction site. We can accommodate those without proper footwear with a sidewalk tour and use the public overlook to view the site. See attached for examples of appropriate footwear.

Safety Equipment: If you are participating in the tour, we will provide you with a hardhat, safety vest and safety glasses before you go on site.

Safety Release: All guests must sign a safety release before entering the construction site.
