TRANSBAY JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

On February 15, 2007, the TJPA Board of Directors approved the appointment of the fifteen inaugural members to the TJPA Citizens Advisory Committee (TJPA CAC). The inaugural CAC meeting was held in April 2007, and the newly appointed members drew lots to determine which would serve initial one-year terms and which would serve full two-year terms. The expiration of subsequent terms has been staggered accordingly.

The TJPA CAC bylaws specify that members be selected to represent the following constituent categories:

- 1. Daily Caltrain Rider into San Francisco
- 2. Daily AC Transit Transbay Rider into San Francisco
- 3. Daily MUNI Rider on a line that terminates at or passes through the Transbay Terminal
- 4. Local Resident from District 6 (zip code 94105 or 94107)
- 5. Local Business from District 6 (zip code 94105 or 94107)
- 6. Environmentalist
- 7. Member of a Planning or Good-Government Non-Profit Organization
- 8. Representative from Labor
- 9. Bicycle Advocate
- 10. Disabled Advocate
- 11. San Francisco Based Public Transit Advocate
- 12. Regional Transit Advocate
- 13. Regional Transit Advocate
- 14. Member of the Citywide (San Francisco) Business Community
- 15. Member with Expertise in Real Estate Development or Real Estate Finance

The criteria for membership were established to ensure a qualified committee of regional stakeholders with a diverse array of knowledge and interest/advocacy aligned with the principal components that define the Transbay Program. Membership requires affiliation with at least one category, and the bylaws further specify that this mix of representation be preserved when replacement members are appointed to the CAC.

Within the last couple of months, three seats became vacant: full-term Member with expertise in real estate development or real estate finance, full-term Daily AC Transit Transbay Rider into San Francisco and mid-term Local Resident from District 6 (zip code 94105 or 94107). Since the first two seats will be up for full-term recruitment in January 2023, we are only recommending filling the mid-term Local Resident from District 6 (zip code 94105 or 94107) seat.

In reviewing the applications received from our recent 2022 recruitment efforts, we found three applicants who had checked the Local Resident from District 6 (zip code 94105 or 94107) category. After reviewing those applications, staff is recommending that the Board of Directors

appoint Natasha Paterson as a new member to fill the Local Resident from District 6 (zip code 94105 or 94107) seat.

APPLICATION SOLICITATION OUTREACH

Prior to forming the CAC, TJPA staff developed, and the TJPA Board of Directors approved, an application for membership that asks for qualifications for membership, a statement of the applicant's objectives and goals, and affiliation(s) and references. This same application has been used in soliciting new members.

In September 2022, the Local Resident from District 6 (zip code 94105 or 94107) seat became vacant. We reviewed the applications received from our recent 2022 recruitment and found three applicants who had checked the Local Resident from District 6 (zip code 94105 or 94107) category and selected the applicant who was most qualified.

APPLICATIONS RECEIVED

The TJPA received three applications from one woman, and two undeclared, who are all San Francisco residents. The applicants' ethnicity included one Caucasian, and two undeclared individuals.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE TJPA CAC

Staff recommends approval of Natasha Paterson for appointment in the indicated category, pursuant to Article 2, Section 4 of the Bylaws of the Transbay Joint Powers Authority Citizens Advisory Committee. The recommended member is a San Francisco Resident of District 6.

NEXT STEPS

The attached resolution appoints the recommended applicant for membership to the TJPA CAC. Upon approval, the appointed member will be invited to the next meeting of the TJPA CAC in December 2022. Meetings are held at the TJPA office at 425 Mission Street, Suite 250, San Francisco, CA 94105.
